74 years ago, on the 24th of October in 1945, the United Nations officially came into being. Nation States came together to sign the founding document, and the UN Charter was started up with the promise to be devoted to making known to the people of the world the aims and achievements of the United Nations and to gain their support for its work. On the 24th of October 2019, the NEIMUN conference was declared open in its Opening Ceremony that was hosted in Sikkim Manipal Institute of Technology, Sikkim. The ceremony was graced by Mr. Samuel S. He stressed upon the importance of the role of youths in the world today and gave key points on how the youths can exercise the power that they possess which can highly contribute in making the world a better place. After the general speakers list, delegates quickly jumped into the informal session. The delegates were then divided into blocks to prepare their working paper for the pending resolutions to be passed. Everyone was well involved in the process and took a part in the decision process. All in all, it was a healthy operation.

The Committee session of IOM formally commenced with an icebreaking session initiated by the trainer, Radip Tandukar. The room was filled with laughter and happy faces. With the agenda on the Access to Medicine in Developing Countries, the committee witnessed wonderful participation in the same. The third Sustainable Development Goal shares a correlation with the agenda as it talks about ensuring healthy lives and promotion of wellbeing for all at all ages. Access to essential medicines as part of the right to the highest attainable standard of health is well-founded in international law. The right to health first emerged as a social right in the World Health Organization (WHO) Constitution and in the Universal Declaration of Human Rights.

The World Health Organization states that essential medicines should be available, of good quality, and accessible.

The Trainer, Miss Laina Singha enlightened the committee about the various problems the nation states are facing in terms of access to medicines and healthcare. Furthermore, the elaborated on how unequal distribution of health care resources create a major hurdle in terms of accessibility. Her words made the delegates ponder about the trade routes, how markets can turn into monopolies, the advent of black markets, and transportation of medicines and healthcare facilities in remote locations.

Soon after, the Chair elections took place and the Delegate of Japan, Surya Prabhat Pali was elected as the Chair after his thundering speech.

"In one term..awesome is how my experience was, I learned communication skills from the committee sessions."


